Subject : Thailand's Electronic Waste (E-Waste) Import ban

Dear Valued Customer,

Thailand's Ministry of Commerce has announced to ban all kind import of foreign electronic waste (e-waste) to ensure protection of the environment & human health or safety.

The following electrical and electronic equipment assemblies or scrap are considered as hazardous waste according to Basel Convention.

- Accumulators and other batteries
- Mercury-switches
- Glass from cathode-ray tubes
- Other activated glasses and PCB-Capacitors, not contaminated with Cadmium, Mercury, Lead Polychlorinated Biphenyl

****E-Waste import under HS code Chapter 84 & 85, only statistic Code 899, specified in the annex is prohibited into Thailand.***

Above regulation is effective immediately for e-waste into Thailand. Failure to comply with above will result in vessel being rejected by customs authority; thus, all on-board laden boxes will not be allowed to discharge at any Thailand terminal.
